Logic Puzzle – Medium Level

Mr. and Mrs. Jackson of Ocean City, Maryland, went on a whirlwind tour of Europe. They visited six countries in only two weeks! In each country, they bought a different present – one for each of their five children and one for the children's grandmother, who baby-sat for the children.

The names of the children and the grandmother were Emma, Scott, Alan, Kerry, Nancy, and Rose. The countries visited by Mr. and Mrs. Jackson were Ireland, England, France, Italy, Spain, and Portugal.

Where was each person's present bought? Who is the grandmother?

Clues

1. Mrs. Jackson bought the youngest child's present in a little shop near the Eiffel Tower.
2. The oldest child got a 3-D puzzle of the Colosseum in Rome.
3. The children were aged 6, 9, 10, 12, and 13.
4. Alan was 7 years younger than Nancy.
5. The age of the child whose present came from Portugal was also the average age of the children.
6. The person whose name is a flower got a present from Ireland.
7. Two children were younger than Emma and two were older than she.
8. Scott asked if he could see his sister's present, a book about the Tower of London.
