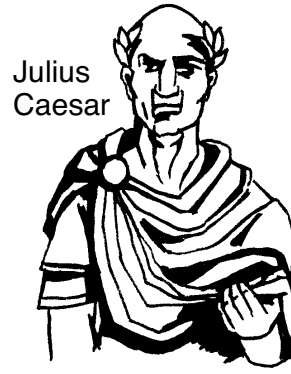


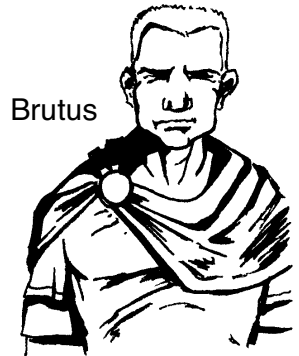
# – HONOUR OR BETRAYAL? –

How does each quotation show each character's role in the play? Are there any other quotations – and any other characters – you think are also important?



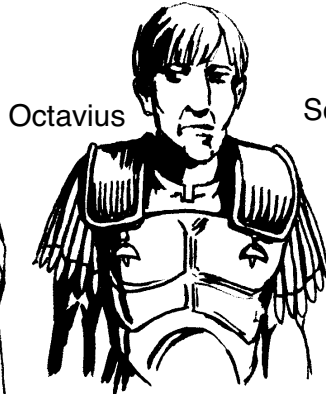
